

Queue Politely  Always wait your turn in line; pushing ahead is rude.	Use "Please" and "Thank You"  Politeness is very important in England.
Avoid Loud Conversations in Public  English people prefer quiet public spaces.	Respect Personal Space  Standing too close to strangers can be uncomfortable.
Don't Ask Personal Questions  Avoid topics like age, salary, or politics.	Keep Eye Contact During Conversations  It shows interest and respect.
<b>Don't be Late</b> Punctuality is valued, especially for work or appointments.	Accept Small Talk  Talking about the weather is common in England.
Use Correct Table Manners  Chew with your mouth closed and don't put elbows on the table.	<b>Tip in Restaurants</b> It's common to tip 10-15% if service is not included.


