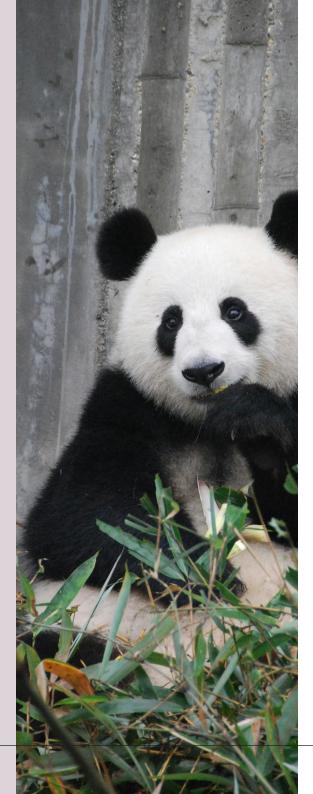


Discuss the questions in pairs.

How does overfishing affect marine life?

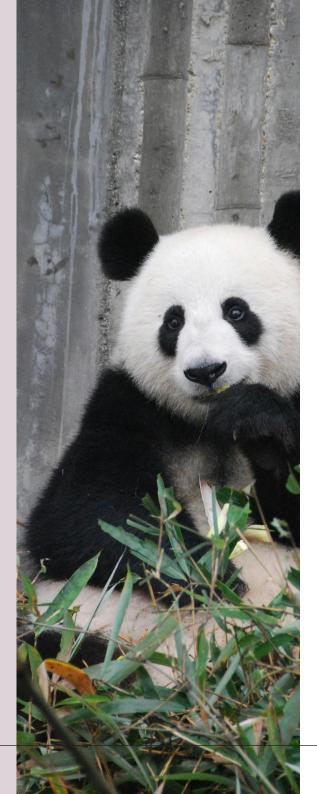
It disrupts ecosystems and puts many species at risk.

### Endangered Animals. Reading.

#### **Endangered Animals Worldwide.**

The giant panda, native to China, is one of the most iconic and endangered animals in the world. With only around 1,800 left in the wild, their population has significantly declined due to deforestation and habitat loss. Conservation initiatives led by organizations like the World Wildlife Fund (WWF) focus on preserving their habitats and planting bamboo forests. These efforts aim to mitigate the effects of deforestation and provide a sustainable environment for pandas to thrive.

African elephants are majestic creatures, yet they are heavily targeted by illegal hunting and poaching for their ivory tusks. Their population has plummeted by 30% in the past seven years, and it is estimated that only around 415,000 elephants remain in the wild. Conservation efforts, including anti-poaching initiatives and international bans on ivory, play a crucial role in combating this threat. By raising awareness and implementing stricter regulations, we can safeguard these magnificent animals and preserve their natural ecosystems.

The leatherback sea turtle faces multiple challenges, including climate change, pollution, and overfishing. It is estimated that there has been a 90% decline in their population over the past three generations. Rising temperatures impact nesting sites, while pollution and plastic debris pose significant threats to their marine habitat. Additionally, accidental capture in fishing nets further endangers their survival. Conservation efforts involve educating local communities, implementing sustainable fishing practices, and protecting nesting beaches.

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### Endangered Animals. Debate.

#### **Scenario**

### **Jaguar Representative**

You are a representative of a large industrial company that wants to build an enormous factory in the forest. Your main objective is to highlight the economic benefits and job opportunities that the factory would bring to the region. You believe that the forest is underutilized and the factory would provide much-needed development and growth. Emphasize the potential for increased revenue, technological advancements, and the overall positive impact on the local economy.

### Greenpeace Representative

You are an environmental activist representing Greenpeace. Your main goal is to protect the forest and its inhabitants. You believe that building an enormous factory would have detrimental effects on the environment, including the destruction of habitats for protected species. Your arguments revolve around the importance of preserving biodiversity, maintaining a sustainable ecosystem, and promoting alternative, eco-friendly solutions. Stress the long-term consequences and advocate for the forest's protection.
